### The Cross Ash Book Fair is Back!!

After a long wait, we are thrilled to announce that the Book Fair will be with us from Monday  $17^{\text{th}}$  October to Friday  $21^{\text{st}}$  October. The Book Fair will contain over 200 titles from as little as £2.99. Children will be able to browse the Fair with their class teacher and let you know what they might like to buy. Every book purchased earns money for the school, which we then use to buy brand new books for the classrooms and libraries. Past Book Fairs have seen us raise over £600 per event for new books and we have really missed this wonderful opportunity to celebrate reading and replenish our book corners.

The Book Fair will be open every day at morning break time (10.30am) and after school. Books and stationery will be available to purchase from our fantastic Year 6 Book Fair team. If you are sending money in with your child please ensure it is in a clearly labelled envelope that can be given to the class teacher for safe keeping.

If you wish to browse the Book Fair after school with your child please wait at the Breakfast Club entrance and a member of staff will let you in once bus lines and walkers have been organised. Children must be accompanied by an adult at all times when visiting the Book Fair. The Book Fair will also be open each evening during Parent Consultations and this is a wonderful opportunity for some Christmas shopping!

We are able to accept cash and cheques at the Book Fair. There is also an option to pay using a QR code, but we do need to keep in mind that our phone signal at Cross Ash is rather intermittent and not always reliable.

Unfortunately we are unable to reserve books as they sell so quickly, but we can order extra copies in for you once payment has been made.

#### FREE SCHOOL MEALS - A NOTE FOR ALL FAMILIES FROM RECEPTION TO YEAR 6

If you receive any of the benefits outlined below, you <u>MUST register</u> for a free school meal through your Local Authority. You may be entitled to other grants which help financially with obtaining school uniform, help with school residential trip costs, free music lesson provision and PE kits for example. <u>THIS IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT FOR YOU AS FAMILIES AND FOR US IN SCHOOL</u>. If you register, we may also get additional money which can be spent on supporting learning in our school.

Even though all Foundation Phase children have free school meals, this is a completely different provision which is open to all. Please apply for Free School Meal Grants, which lead to additional grants too, if you receive any of the benefits below. Times are difficult and help is there.

Qualifying benefits include:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

#### How to register

If you are in receipt of any of the benefits listed above, your benefits team in the Local Authority can help you.




#### Year 5
